The talk will explore the various situations of the Romanians and Jews during the Great War, from their identity status to their contribution and struggle in the historical background. The lecture will also include references to the situation and life of the Romanian Jewry during the interwar period, as well as to the recent rise of Anti-Semitism and right wing parties in today's Europe.



Adrian Cioroianu is a Romanian professor, author, historian, journalist and essayist. He is currently a university professor and the Dean of the Faculty of History at the University of Bucharest. Between 2007 and 2008 he was the Romanian Minister of Foreign Affairs.
