1925-1927 and 1930-1935 are the years of his stay in Paris, where he ended up by re-

joining the surrealist group.

In 1934 his first exhibition in Paris, presented by André Breton, Galerie Pierre. In 1935-1938, he was back in Romania, where he became the messenger of surrealism. His disciples: Gherasim Luca and Gellu Naum. In 1938 he settled in France for good. That same year he lost his left eye, in a fight among painter friends, after having painted for years precognitive paintings. In 1948 he was expelled from the surrealist group for "individualism" and he was re-integrated there in 1959. In 1966 an entire room was consecrated to him at the Venice Biennial. His work is a continuous quest for the marvelous.

IANCU, Marcel (b. 1895, Bucharest, d. 1984, Ein Hod, Israel).

Architect, painter, theoretician. Participated, side by side with Tristan Tzara, in the Dada adventure in Zurich. Founder or co-founder of several artistic groups: 1918, at Bâle, *Das neue Leben*, with Arp, Giacometti, T¦uber, etc., and the international group of Radical Artists with Arp, Giacometti, Richter, Eggeling, etc. After a short stay in Paris, he returned to Romania in 1922, where he became the messenger of the new spirit. Co-founder, with Ion Vinea, of *Contimporanul*. One-man shows and participation in exhibitions with other artists until 1939. Activity as an architect. Theoretical articles on painting and architecture.

LUCA, Gherasim (Zollmann Locker) (b. July 23, 1913, Bucharest, d. 1994, Paris).

Poet and theoretician.

Co-founder with Gellu Naum, of the Romanian surrealist Group, 1940.

Painter, theoretician. Contributor: Contimporanul, Punct, Unu.

Co-founder of the *Integral* magazine. Organized and participated in avant-garde exhibitions. Professor at the Academy of Decorative Arts. In 1925 he founded the "Integral" constructivist art Workshop. Theoretical articles on modern painting.

MICHAILESCU, Corneliu (b. August 20, 1887, Bucharest, d. 1965, Bucharest).
